SHARE 'THE GOOD NEWS'

Among the stories which surround the Resurrection, is the delightful experience of two disciples as they returned home. Like the other disciples, they too had been disappointed at the tragic end to Jesus' life, all their dreams shattered, all their expectations unfulfilled. It was on their journey back to Emmaus, that "a fellow traveller" joined them. It was common for travellers to walk in groups, both for companionship as well as for security. The traveller/Jesus, who came to seek out the lost, met them in their dejection. They had expected so much from Jesus, they had looked forward to a Messiah who would free them from the Roman oppressors, but now it was all over.

Jesus met them in their confusion, and going over the Scriptures, he led them gently through what had been prophesied, that the Son of Man would suffer, die and rise on the third day. An offer of hospitality saw Jesus stop and share a meal with them. Following the meal, and the breaking of bread, Jesus disappeared suddenly from their sight. It was then that their eyes were opened, and they realized that Jesus had actually risen. Here was the reason why "their hearts had burnt with fire" while Jesus had been talking to them along the road.
