Today we welcome our primary school teachers, students and their families to the Start of School Year Mass.

A NEW COMMANDMENT

"I have not come to abolish the Law..." said Jesus. How could he? He was a Jew, after all, and a devout one. He had been brought up to obey the Law, he had studied it in the local synagogue, and he had taught it. "...I have come to perfect it, (or) to bring it, to perfection." Jesus implies that there is more to the observance to the Law which we should keep, and which has to do with our right relationships with our brothers and sisters. By way of explanation and clarification, Jesus, the consummate teacher puts forward some examples.

Murder is obviously forbidden under the Law, but the Law speaks only of an actual, external act. Jesus 'completes, perfects' this Law by reminding us that the anger, the hatred of the person in question is itself wrong, because it goes against the expectation that we relate honestly and justly with our neighbour, and that we should refrain

from entertain murderous, angry thoughts against them. At another time, and in what we could well consider his last will and testament, Jesus asked us, to love your neighbour as yourself, and to love one another as I have loved you."

Likewise, the Law forbids adultery, an obvious external act. Jesus goes further than this prohibition, by telling us that, "by looking at a woman lustfully, (one) has already committed adultery." Jesus provides more examples today, and will provide others next week as we continue to read Matthew's gospel.

In conclusion, and quoting a commentator, 'The written scripture and their interpretation in tradition are surpassed by Jesus, whose life and teaching are definitive revelations of the will of God.'
